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Every Day and Every Minute Counts

Research shows that children with good attendance perform better in their exams than those with poor attendance. When your child <u>misses</u> school, they are missing out on valuable learning. If they miss school regularly, they are missing out on learning that may never be caught up.

Friendships and social activities are a vital part of school life that enhances self-confidence and wellbeing. When children experience extended absence, they often struggle to integrate back into friendship groups and can experience social difficulties, alongside struggling with their academic studies.


